Description

Introduces the theory and practice of human communication. Surveys communication topics related to interpersonal, small group, and public communication.

Course Competencies

- 1. Identify human communication principles, models, and model elements.
- 2. Describe the influence of verbal/nonverbal messages, individual and social perception, cultural/ gender variables, and technology in the human communication process.
- **3.** Practice interpersonal communication skills related to perception, self-concept, active listening, language choice, self-disclosure, and relationships.
- **4.** Contribute to a variety of group types, group roles (leadership, relational, task and individual), and group development stages necessary for organizing, planning, and managing group activities.
- **5.** Demonstrate public communication skills including research, organization, outlining, audience analysis, and effective delivery relative to imposed time constraints.

Graded Assignments

- 1. Reading/lecture quizzes online (5-10 @ 15 points each)
- 2. Class preparation assignments & learning summaries (10-15 @ 5 to 15 points each)
- 3. Object story presentation (25 points) *
- 4. Written reflections (2-3 @ 25 points)
- 5. Group project assignment (25 points)
- 6. Final oral presentation (30 points) *

* Both oral presentations must be completed to qualify for a passing grade in this course.

Final grades are determined on a 100% scale, where 90-100 = A; 80-89 = B; and so forth.

Assignment Policies

- I. Reading/lecture quizzes online, class preparation assignments, and learning summaries will usually be submitted in CANVAS by the posted deadline for each assignment. In all cases, reading/lecture quizzes online, class preparation assignments, and learning summaries will not be accepted late.
- 2. For written reflection assignments, you may ask for a 24 hour extension of a due date. No written reflection assignments will be accepted 7 days after the due date, and will be recorded as a zero.
- 3. All assignments (class preparation, learning summaries, & written reflections) must be typed, double spaced. Your submissions should reflect college level writing. Take advantage of instructor office hours, the communication tutor, or the SCC writing center if you need help with any assignments.
- 4. For assigned oral presentation dates, you are strongly encouraged to meet your scheduled date. Missing your scheduled oral presentation date creates rescheduling challenges.
- 5. You can expect major assignments to be graded within seven days of the assignment's due date.
- 6. You may be administratively withdrawn from the course once you have a total of four missing assignments.
