Instructional Contact Hours (Seat Time)

This is an accelerated, eight week, three (3) credit-hour course. Online learning is convenient, but not easy. You have the same amount of work (total) in this class that you would have in a traditional class, but in only one half the time! This means your workload will he heavier each week than you might think.

To be successful in this class, you must be committed to putting in an appropriate amount of time and effort each week. While the exact amount of time will vary, depending on your own circumstances, you should expect to spend between 8 and 10 hours per week for direct learning activities (class discussions, quizzes, case studies, and questions for the instructor). You will also need to budget substantial time to complete on indirect activities such as reading the textbook, reviewing assignment instructions, taking notes, watching videos, and doing research.

Online Tutoring

Online and hybrid students now have access to 24/7 online tutoring via *Brainfuse*. You may utilize up to 6 hours of online tutoring per semester for free.
