Study of grammar and vocabulary of the Spanish language and study of Spanish speaking cultures. Emphasis on speaking, reading and writing skills.

Please be aware that simply logging-in and looking around, or emailing me, does not satisfy this requirement. You must complete and submit a graded assignment to indicate that you are not absent. After successfully making this deadline, you will need to continue completing work regularly in order to remain in the class.

Homework: You must submit all homework through the appropriate assignment boxes in Canvas. Emailed attachments and submissions made in the Comment area of assignments will not be accepted for credit. Audio and video submissions must be submitted correctly (processed by Canvas): NOT uploaded as a **link** to a file. If you are experiencing a technical issue with Canvas, please contact the Help Desk (480) 423-6274 to have it resolved before you miss additional homework.

Late work: All work (except the Preliminary and Final assessments modules) is due on **Sundays**. *Excluding* the First and Final weeks of class, you will have a **four-day grace period** following the due date in which to submit the work without penalty (until the **Thursday** after the due date). Once the Assignment closes, you will no longer be able to complete it nor submit it.

For example, you will have work due on Sunday, January 22nd. If you get to all of it, great, and if not, no worries; you still have until Thursday, January 26th to complete it. All assignments are due at 11:59PM Arizona time.

Assignments

CATEGORY	PERCENTAGE	DESCRIPTION
Pronunciation	10%	<i>Evaluation of pronunciation based on topics covered, pronunciation improvement throughout the semester. These are mostly audio, but may include some writing.</i>
Practice	20%	<i>Practice activities are the most numerous and include a number of 'Actividades' in each lesson. These practice vocabulary acquisition, grammar application, and culture.</i>
Speaking	15%	<i>These consist of either 1) a situation that you need to <u>prepare and record</u> or 2) answer <u>a series of questions</u> that come from the material of the lesson: some may require a video submission, but most are audio submissions.</i>
Writing	10%	<i>These are designed for you to demonstrate mastery of the Module's material. Using vocabulary that was not presented and grammatical structures that have not been covered yet will affect your grade adversely.</i>
Reading	10%	<i>Reading assignments consist of a reading that relates to the theme of the lesson vocabulary and/or grammar, but as many are <u>realia</u> (from authentic sources), they may contain new vocabulary and unfamiliar grammar structures.</i>
Listening	10%	<i>Listening assignments consist of a monologue, narrative, interview, or conversation that relates to the theme of the lesson vocabulary and grammar. Exercises vary.</i>
Final	25%	<i>There are final assessments chosen from Reading, Writing, Speaking, Listening and Pronunciation. This grade category also includes a Cultural Project, a Course Evaluation, and an Exit Survey.</i>

Response Time

Students can expect a response time of 48 hours, excluding weekends and Holidays, for the instructor to respond to messages sent via the Canvas Learning Management System or email. Though I sometimes need additional time, students can, in general, expect assignments to be graded within 1-2 weeks of the assignment's **due date**.

Attendance Policy

Attendance is **timely completion of online work**. If you stop completing your graded work and haven't submitted anything for a period of two weeks for 15-week classes (or *one week* for 8-week and 5-week classes), you may be withdrawn without prior notice.

Instructional Contact Hours (Seat Time)

This is a four (4) credit-hour course. Plan to spend at least three hours on course content or seat time (direct instruction) and six hours on homework weekly. Accelerated courses will require additional time per week.

Online Tutoring
